

## CLINICAL COMPETENCE

CARDUP registry requires assessment of competence in both clinical skills and academic knowledge.

### **Clinical Competence:**

Students in Canadian Medical Association (CMA) accredited programs have a distinct advantage with CARDUP, CMA accredited programs conduct the Clinical Skills Assessment Process (CSAP) within the program.

The CSAP provides the evidence that the student has achieved the standard of clinical competence as defined in the National Competency Profile (NCP). As an exempt, students using the Generalist CSAP are evaluated on both professional behavior and 21 specific exam type competencies while in their clinical practice.

On successful completion of the CSAP and the program, the program delegate submits the appropriate documentation to CARDUP for each of their students.
